In the 1 August 2020 post entitled "Ongoing Mayor bullying" which Mr Churchman clearly wrote, he made further accusations against a number of elected members.
- 3 KCDC elected members have a set of standards that they are expected to adhere to, including avoiding conduct which is aggressive, offensive or abusive or which may constitute unlawful or inappropriate behaviour (including sexual harassment).

BACKGROUND

- 3 Budget allocations for the 2020/21 financial year to the Waikanae Promotion Fund, Discretionary Grants Fund and Waikanae Capital Improvement Fund are listed in the table below.
- In addition, at its meeting on 17 June 2020 the Council resolved that 'The Council approves the Community Boards to carry-over any unspent 2019/20 grants to 2020/21'.

- Accountability reports on grants allocated are required six months after the event or activity for which the grant was awarded takes place. Accountability reports received since the last Board meeting are attached to this report as **Appendix 3**.
- An amount of approximately \$1.065 million is held in the Waikanae Capital Improvement Fund and this is expected to reduce to \$1.028 million by the end of the current financial year. The following table shows how the funds have been allocated:

CONSIDERATIONS

Issues

- 8 Grants are allocated in accordance with the specific criteria (attached to this report as **Appendix 1**).
- 9 All applicants have been advised by email of the meeting date, time and location.

Discretionary Grants Fund

- There is currently \$8,018 available for distribution in the 2020/21 financial year (which includes \$400 previously approved via a 3-year application).
- 11 New grant applications totalling \$2,000 are presented for the Board's consideration.

Grants previously approved

Combined Lions Club of Kapiti

- 12 At its meeting of 28 April 2019 the Waikanae Community Board approved the payment of three years of grants to the Combined Lions Club of Kapiti, to assist with the costs of the annual Lions Foodbank Collection.
- 13 The third and final payment of \$400 is due in August 2020.

Ōtaki and Districts RSA

- At its meeting of 17 March 2020 (via telcon) the Waikanae Community Board approved the payment of three years of grants to the Ōtaki and Districts RSA, to assist with the costs of the annual ANZAC Day commemorative service in Waikanae. Due to Covid-19 the ANZAC Day activities in 2020 were cancelled, so these payments are to commence in 2021.
- 15 The first payment of \$500 is due in March 2021.

New grant applications received

Kidz Need Dadz Wellington

- Funding of \$500 is sought to assist with the cost of the annual Fathers Day community event being held on 6 September 2020.
- 17 This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Community, cultural or sports purposes, including travel both within New Zealand and overseas.

Feline Fix

- Funding of \$500 is sought to assist with the cost of desexing and rehoming cats, for those families who are unable to do so themselves.
- 19 This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Community, cultural or sports purposes, including travel both within New Zealand and overseas.

Ferndale Residents Association

- Funding of \$500 is sought to assist with the cost of rabbit-proofing the community orchard in the Ferndale subdivision.
- 21 This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Community, cultural or sports purposes, including travel both within New Zealand and overseas.

Mulled Wine Concerts

- Funding of \$500 is sought to assist with the cost of providing a concert on 16 August 2020, including website costs, hall hire, publicity and piano tuning.
- This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Community, cultural or sports purposes, including travel both within New Zealand and overseas.

Promotion Fund

- There is currently \$47,399 available for distribution in the 2020/21 financial year (which includes \$4,500 previously approved via a 3-year application).
- New grant applications totalling \$9,539.75 are presented for the Board's consideration.

Grants previously approved

Lions Club of Waikanae

- At its meeting of 23 June 2020 the Waikanae Community Board approved the payment of three years of grants to the Lions Club of Waikanae, to assist with the costs of the Super Spring Garden Trails held in January each year.
- 27 The first payment of \$4,500 is due in September 2020.

New grant applications received

Discover Kapiti Heritage Group

Funding of \$350 is sought to assist with the cost of holding a history and heritage event to be run over Wellington Anniversary weekend in January 2021.

This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Contributing to making Waikanae a Good Place to Live and Eligible Purpose 3: Attracting visitors to the area.

Tara Fitzgerald

- Funding of \$500 was granted to Tara in September 2019, to assist with the cost of attending the Ollerup gymnastic academy in Denmark (a copy of her earlier application is attached to Tara's current application, for the Board's information).
- Due to Covid-19, the school went into lockdown in March 2020, with the next semester now starting in August 2020. Tara has been offered another scholarship to stay at the school until the end of the year, but requires financial assistance to do so and has submitted an application for further funding of \$1,000.
- 32 This application can be considered as a result of Covid-19.

Kapiti Coast Museum

- 33 Funding of \$1,983.75 is sought to assist with the cost of upgrading their website.
- 34 This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Contributing to making Waikanae a Good Place to Live.

Mahara Gallery

- Funding of \$2,706 is sought to assist with the cost of running a monthly column in a local community newspaper.
- This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Contributing to making Waikanae a Good Place to Live, Eligible Purpose 3: Attracting visitors to the area and Eligible Purpose 4: Promoting Waikanae as a Visitor Destination.

Waikanae Boating Club

- Funding of \$3,500 is sought to assist with the cost of running the annual 'Youth and Community Fishing' event in 2021, 2022 and 2023. **Note this is a 3-year funding application.**
- 38 This activity can be considered under Eligible Purpose 1: Contributing to making Waikanae a Good Place to Live.

ATTACHMENT 1

WAIKANAE COMMUNITY BOARD DISCRETIONARY GRANTS – CRITERIA

Priority

Groups or individuals who promise a future input into the development of community, cultural or sports activities within the district.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicants must reside in the Waikanae Ward.
- Groups must be non-profit making.
- Applications may only be made once in a 12 month period, calculated from the date funding was last received, except in exceptional circumstances and at the Board's discretion.

Applications will be considered for:

- Community, cultural or sports purposes, including travel both within New Zealand and overseas.
- Groups or individuals who are unable to receive sufficient grants from other sources because of the time frame or because they are otherwise ineligible.
- Grants to partially or fully offset the cost of any Council permit, licence or resource consent fees on the basis that the proposed activity falls into a "worthy cause" category.
- 4. The remission of hall rental for "worthy causes" in line with Council policy that all remissions of hall rentals are accounted for by being funded from approved grants budgets.
- 5. Where an application for funding for a particular purpose might be received from individual members of an organisation and from the organisation as a whole, preference will be given to ONLY funding the organisation as a whole.
- 6. Where an organisation anticipates that it will require ongoing annual funding, to be used for the same purpose each year, it may apply for three consecutive years of annual funding within a single application. If such an application is approved, the funding will be released in annual instalments. The second and third instalments will only be released once the Community Board has received a satisfactory accountability report in relation to the previous year's funding. First-time applicants to the Discretionary Grants Fund will not be eligible for three years of annual funding.

Ineligible purposes

- Capital expenditure.
- Expenses incurred for school curriculum activities.
- Grants will not be considered retrospectively and must be received by the Kāpiti Coast
 District Council prior to the event taking place and at least eight working days before the
 Community Board meeting date.
- 4. Activities for which funding has already been received from either the Grants Allocation Committee or one of the other community boards in the district will not be eligible for further funding from the Waikanae Community Board for the same activities.

Notwithstanding all of the above, the Waikanae Community Board has the right if justification can be proven, to make a grant outside the criteria.

WAIKANAE COMMUNITY BOARD DISCRETIONARY GRANTS – CRITERIA

Grant allocation guidelines

In order to ensure that funds are managed carefully throughout the entire financial year, funds for sporting or travel activity will generally have a maximum amount payable as follows:

For sports/competitions (including associated travel costs):

\$100	Participation in a national or international event without selection (i.e. if you pay you can participate)
\$200	Competing in a national event (after selection)
\$500	Competing in an international event (after selection)
For travel:	:
\$200	To attend coaching/training clinics out of Waikanae (national or international), which will benefit more members of the community
\$200	Attending national AGMs (or similar) for Waikanae community groups
\$250	Attending national AGMs (or similar) for very active or highly beneficial Waikanae community groups

For all other applications, the maximum grant payable is \$500 per grant.

Applicants must provide at least three quotes for any items to be purchased with the grant money.

Note - all applications must include full supporting documentation.

Consideration of Grants

Grants will be considered quarterly and at each meeting the Board will allocate up to 25% of the annual budget, with the exception of the last meeting of the financial year, which may allocate all remaining funds available.

In a given financial year, the Council may not allocate sufficient funding to the Community Board to enable it to pay all grants arising from three year funding arrangements approved in a previous year. In such situations the available funding will be distributed on a pro-rata basis to those organisations to which funding has already been approved.

Accountability

Applicants must provide evidence that the money was spent for the purpose granted, within **six months** of receipt of the grant.

WAIKANAE COMMUNITY BOARD PROMOTION FUND - CRITERIA

Priority

Groups or individuals who, through their activities, are promoting the Waikanae Ward.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Applications must be for promotions within the Waikanae Ward.
- Applications will be considered for "events based" activities.
- Applications will be considered for exceptional circumstances.

Applications must include an outline of the expected benefits to the Waikanae Ward.

Does the application promote Waikanae by:

- 1. Contributing to making Waikanae a Good Place to Live; or
- 2. Contributing to making Waikanae an Active Community; or
- 3. Attracting visitors to the area; or
- Promoting Waikanae as a visitor destination.

To allow the Community Board to forward plan they encourage organisations to provide an annual calendar of events and activities, and to note the activities which they may need funding for.

Applicants must provide at least 3 quotes for any items to be purchased with the grant money.

Applicants are to give full details of the reason for application, and amount requested, and to note any other applications for funding currently sought from other bodies.

Where an application for funding for a particular purpose might be received from individual members of an organisation and from the organisation as a whole, preference will be given to ONLY funding the organisation as a whole.

Where an organisation anticipates that it will require ongoing annual funding, to be used for the same purpose each year, it may apply for three consecutive years of annual funding within a single application. If such an application is approved, the funding will be released in annual instalments. The second and third instalments will only be released once the Community Board has received a satisfactory accountability report in relation to the previous year's funding. First-time applicants to the Promotion Fund will not be eligible for three years of annual funding.

In a given financial year, the Council may not allocate sufficient funding to the Community Board to enable it to pay all grants arising from three year funding arrangements approved in a previous year. In such situations the available funding will be distributed on a pro-rata basis to those organisations to which funding has already been approved.

Activities for which funding has already been received from either the Grants Allocation Committee or one of the other community boards in the district will not be eligible for funding from the Waikanae Community Board for the same activities.

Accountability

Successful applicants will be asked to provide a report on how the grant was spent, within **six months** of receipt of the grant.

Successful applicants must contact the Community Board immediately if, for any reason, they are unable to use the grant funding for the purposes for which it was originally approved.

Procedure for applications

Applications are to be made on the approved application form and addressed to: Tracey Waye, Kāpiti Coast District Council, Private Bag 60601, Paraparaumu 5254 or email: tracey.waye@kapiticoast.govt.nz.

Notwithstanding all of the above, the Waikanae Community Board has the right if justification can be proven, to make a grant outside the criteria.

Applications will not be considered retrospectively and must be received by the Kāpiti Coast District Council prior to the event taking place and at least eight working days before the Community Board meeting date.

6.3 UPDATE ON THE 2009 BEACH BYLAW REVIEW

Author: Aston Mitchell, Policy Advisor

PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report provides the Board with a progress update on the 2009 Beach Bylaw Review Project, including the high level results from the Beach Bylaw Survey for the Waikanae Ward.

The Beach Bylaw Survey results for the Waikanae Ward are attached as Appendix 1 to this report.

DELEGATION

3 Under section D of the Governance Structure and Delegations for the 2019-2022 Triennium community boards have the "authority to listen, articulate, advise, advocate and make recommendations to Council on any matter of interest or concern to the local community".

BACKGROUND

- The 2009 Beach Bylaw Review is on the Council-approved Policy Work Programme, and commenced in February 2019.
- 5 Bylaw reviews are generally carried out in three phases:
 - Phase 1 includes:
 - pre-consultation engagement, data collection, and analysis
 - o the identification of issues and options, and
 - the development of proposed revisions to the existing bylaw.
 - Phase 2 includes development of, and consultation on, a draft Bylaw, in accordance with the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA 2002) special consultative procedure.
 - Phase 3 involves the analysis of submissions, leading to a final draft of the revised
 Beach Bylaw, which is then presented to Council for final consideration and adoption.
- Phase 1 pre-consultation engagement activities were underway but have been delayed due to the Covid-19 restrictions. This report provides an update on the phase 1 work that was completed prior to Covid-19 lockdown, the phase 1 activities that still need to be done and the amended timeframes that are now necessary to complete the Beach Bylaw review.

DISCUSSION

- 7 Before the Covid-19 lockdown, Council Officers held a number of information sessions, workshops and meetings with stakeholders across the District, to source direct input on specific issues and encourage participation in the Beach Bylaw Survey.
- A number of additional engagement activities were planned for Phase 1, but could not proceed under the Covid-19 restrictions. Now that New Zealand has moved to a lower alert level, Council Officers can progress the planned engagement activities that had to be deferred. Officers have already met with a number of parties but there are a number of conversations that still need to take place.
- 9 Council Officers are developing a good understanding of how our community uses our beaches and the issues integral to both supporting these activities and protecting the health and safety of beach users. Remaining engagements will further inform Officers of any issues and/or options necessary to develop proposed revisions (if any), to the existing Beach Bylaw.

- The information collected during Phase 1 will be used to develop a draft 2021 Beach Bylaw and Statement of Proposal that will be released for public consultation in accordance with the LGA 2002 requirements for special consultative procedures.
- The information collected from the formal consultation period will then be considered and will input into a final draft 2021 Beach Bylaw, which will be presented to Council for final consideration and adoption in Phase 3.

Revised Timeframes for the Review

- In January 2019, the proposed timeframe for the phase 2 consultation stage was rescheduled until after the October 2019 election (previously targeted for May 2019), because Officers were concerned that the election would result in a large time-gap between the public consultation period and the final Beach Bylaw adoption.
- In December 2019, the Committee approved the Phase 2 consultation stage to occur in May 2020. However, due to delays to phase 1 caused by Covid-19 restrictions, the timeframe to complete this Bylaw review needs to be further revised.
- 14 Phase 2 consultation is now scheduled to start in October 2020, and will result in the presentation of a new Beach Bylaw for Council adoption in early 2021.
- 15 Table 1 below outlines the key changes to the target dates for the review.

Insights from the Districtwide Beach Bylaw survey

- One of the pre-engagement activities completed in Phase 1, was the two-part Kāpiti Coast Beach Bylaw Survey. The survey sought to discover (a) how people felt about activities on the beach and (b) what people thought about the existing Beach Bylaw and beach accessways.
- 17 The survey opened on 30 January 2020 and closed on 30 April 2020. There were 1,724 responses to the survey and 91% of all respondents completed the entire survey. The Districtwide Survey results are available on the Council's website.
- Detailed analysis of the survey results is outside the scope of this report. However, respondents' trends and issues are noted briefly below.
- 19 The survey's 1724 respondents were mainly:
 - living in Paraparaumu Beach, followed by Waikanae Beach, and then Ōtaki Beach
 - between 40 and 69 years of age, and
 - either not of Māori descent or chose not to answer.

- Although there appears to be a wide range of thoughts in regards to what the respondents want for our beaches, overall, the majority of them were comfortable with the current Beach Bylaw rules and their beach experiences. For example, the majority of respondents:
 - are aware of the multiple pedestrian access points which allow them to park and walk a short distance to the beach.
 - think the current rules about vehicles on beaches are right.
 - think the current rules about riding horses on beaches are right.
 - are not happy with two-wheeled motor bikes being on the beach.
 - think the rules should cover longlines and kontiki systems.
- 21 There were strong opinions in several areas. For example, for specific questions:
 - 86% of respondents were angry or annoyed about 'reckless driving' and 72% were angry or annoyed about 'people driving cars in non-permitted areas'
 - 51% were angry or annoyed about 'longlines in swimming areas'.
- 22 There were also differing opinions based on locality. For example:
 - for vehicles on the beach respondents from Waikanae were concerned about vehicles driving through the estuary, while respondents in the northern beaches were less concerned unless it involved reckless driving.
- of for longlines respondents in the longer northern beaches were okay with longline use as long as the lines were monitored, while respondents from Paekākāriki were very concerned about the impact of longline use on swimmers.

Insights from the Waikanae Ward Beach Bylaw survey

The survey results for the Waikanae Ward are attached as Appendix 1 to this report.

CONSIDERATIONS

Policy considerations

25 There are no policy considerations in addition to those outlined in this report.

Legal considerations

- The current Beach Bylaw was adopted on 7 May 2009 and was, in accordance with s159 of the LGA 2002, due to be reviewed by 7 May 2019. As the review was not completed by 7 May 2019, s160A of the LGA 2002 came into effect which requires that the Beach Bylaw will be revoked automatically if the review is not completed within two years, being by 7 May 2021.
- This final date for statutory review was further extended to 30 June 2021, by provisions in the COVID-19 Response (Further Management Measures) Legislation Act 2020, which temporarily suspend s160A of the LGA 2002 until 30 June 2021. This means that any bylaws that would be automatically revoked before this date will continue in force until then.
- A public complaint has been made to the Human Rights Commission, on the basis that the questions in the survey about disability access were biased and discriminated by way of age and disability. A Council response has been provided to the Human Rights Commission and we have recently received a request for mediation on the matter.

Financial considerations

29 This review will be carried out within existing Annual Plan budgets.

Tāngata whenua considerations

30 Council Officers will work alongside each of our lwi partners to understand their aspirations with regards to the Beach Bylaw review. Where Council Officers have received previous

relevant guidance from our lwi partners, such as 'Whakarongotai o te moana, Whakarongotai o te wā' the lwi Kaitiakitanga Plan of Te Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai, this will be used as foundational guidance to inform further work with lwi.

Strategic considerations

31 Toitū Kāpiti includes aspirations for strong, safe communities and a thriving environment.

The Beach Bylaw assists in the attainment of these aspirations because it seeks to enhance the safety of the public on the beach, while also protecting the beach natural environment.

SIGNIFICANCE AND ENGAGEMENT

Significance policy

32 In accordance with the LGA 2002, a special consultative procedure will be required for this Beach Bylaw review.

Consultation already undertaken

As noted above, conversations have already occurred with a variety of key stakeholders and further discussions to best inform Phase 1 still need to take place.

Publicity

The Beach Bylaw Survey results (both Districtwide and by each Ward) are all publically available on the Council's website. The revised timeframes to complete the 2009 Beach Bylaw review are also available on the Council's website.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- That the Waikanae Community Board receives and notes this report, including Appendix 1 to this report.
- That the Waikanae Community Board notes that the Beach Bylaw survey results (both Districtwide and by Ward), will be made publically available on the Council's website.

























13. Which statement best describes your thoughts on the rules from Peka Peka to Ōtaki? (n=363)





Horses on the beach


15. Which statement best describes your thoughts on these rules about horses? (n=365)

6.4 ROAD NAMING - STAGE 1 OF 2 FOR A NEW SUBDIVISION RM190153 AT 104 NGARARA ROAD, WAIKANAE.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The report asks the Waikanae Community Board to approve two new road names for a 17 lot subdivision at 104 Ngarara Road, Waikanae. This subdivision is Stage 1 of 2.

DELEGATION

The Waikanae Community Board has the delegated authority to consider this matter under 'Part D Community Boards' of the Governance Structure:

Accepting or rejecting officer recommendations in respect of **names for local** roads (excluding the former State Highway) and any **reserves**, **structures and commemorative places**, in accordance with existing council policy.

BACKGROUND

- Under the Kāpiti Coast District Council's (Council) policy, developers are required to submit three name suggestions, in preferential order, for each road to be named, whether it is public or private.
- 4 Supplementary information in support of the names is to be provided by the developer in writing, and this may be consistent themes, historical connections or names of previous owners.
- The Waikanae Community Board has a responsibility to ensure that the road names are unique to the district. This is for public safety and avoidance of confusion for emergency and utility services, as call centres are often located away from the district.
- The Waikanae Community Board may accept one of the proposed names within the report or reject all suggested names and request that staff provide alternative names in a subsequent report.
- 7 The developer is Leith Consulting Limited.

ISSUES AND OPTIONS

Issues

- The complete proposed development is for 17 new residential allotments and the creation of two new roads. This report refers to the naming of the roads required for Stage 1 of 2, shown as New Road 1 (Primary) and New Road 2 (Cul-de-sac), shown on Appendix 1 to this report.
- 9 The options submitted are all acceptable as per the Australian/New Zealand Standard rural and urban addressing AS/NZS 4819:2011.
- The developers from Leith Consulting Limited wish to collaborate with mana whenua to offer names which contribute to the visibility and recognition of the area's history, and also suggesting names of iwi significance. They would like to incorporate a theme whereby a hybrid of names be put forward from mana whenua and the developer.
- The overall development is to be known as 'Anderson Park' and a sign is proposed at the entrance off Ngārara Road. A new pedestrian accessway is also being formed within the subdivision and will provide a direct link through to Waikanae park.

Item 6.4 Page 79

12 The three names provided in preferential order for **New Road 1 (Primary)** are as follows:

Option 1

Anderson Park Drive

The preferred name for the new subdivision is Anderson Park Drive. This road name would commemorate the Anderson family who have farmed the property for the last 70 years. Hugh Mainland Anderson was the first family member to obtain the land in the Ngarara West A, Section 41. The name 'Anderson Park Drive' would be unique nationwide.

Option2

Anderson Drive

Again, commemorating the Anderson family who have farmed the property for the last 70 years. 'Anderson Drive' appears to be unique nationwide with the nearest similar name being 'Anderson Grove' in Lower Hutt.

Option 3 Helen Way

To acknowledge and commemorate Helen Anderson, who is the last member of the Anderson family to have farmed on this land. Helen still lives on land adjoining the subdivision. 'Helen Way' appears to be unique nationwide, with the nearest similar name being 'Helen Street' in Wellington, and 'Helena Place' in Fielding.

13 The three names provided in preferential order for **New Road 2 (Cul-de-sac)** are as follows:

Option 1

Mata Te Hawe Place

Mata Te Hawe was an original owner of the land from around the late 1800's and the parcel of land was known as Ngarara West A, Section 41. To name the second road after Mata Te Hawe would be a strong reference to those ancestors who lived in the area and also acknowledge her land ownership. Mata Te Hawe also owned 2 other parcels of land in the Waikanae beach area known as Ngarara West A, Block 14 and 15.

Option 2

Kaiwaru Place

'Kaiwaru', is the name of the trig station now within the adjoining Waikanae Park. The new pedestrian accessway that is being created within the subdivision will not only provide a direct link to Waikanae Park but also to the dune on which Kaiwaru is situated.

Option 3

Sandhills View

Is a prominent ridge of sand dunes that is visible from within the subdivision. The reference 'Sand Hills' is also noted on a re-drawn version of a survey plan - ML 1491 that is dated from around the late 1890's. The start of Sand Hills was from the mouth of the Waikanae River, on the North side encompassing approximately 260 acres of the foreshore.

CONSIDERATIONS

Policy considerations

14 The Council Road Naming and Street Numbering Policy: 2011 states that to ensure that road names reflect the objectives, developers (or residents of private right-of-ways) shall provide three suitable names for each road on their plans when submitting their engineering survey drawings, in order of preference and with rationale behind each name.

Item 6.4 Page 80

- Developers shall consult with Iwi or hapū prior to submitting proposed names to the Council (contact names will be provided by Council). Developers must state what consultation they have had with hapū or Iwi, the Historical Society or other community groups for the names proposed to help ensure accuracy and consistency.
- Proposed names should avoid the names of kin unless they have strong historical links to the geographical area.
- Throughout the naming process Te Āti Awa ki Whakarongotai have been consulted as has Anthony Dreaver who is a representative for the Historical Society. The Trust and Mr Dreaver have supported the options provided.

Legal considerations

The Council and its Community Boards can name roads, pursuant to Sections 319 and 319A of the Local Government Act 1974.

Financial considerations

19 The cost of signage is borne by the developer as per usual conditions of the Resource Consent.

Tāngata whenua considerations

20 There are no additional iwi or Treaty of Waitangi issues arising from this report.

4 PUBLIC SPEAKING TIME

<u>Kevin Sheppard</u> spoke to the grant application from the Waikanae Lions Club, for three years of funding to assist with the cost of the Super Spring Garden Trails which are held in January each year.

<u>Quentin Poole</u> spoke about the application made by Council to the Provincial Growth Fund to assist with the redevelopment of the Waikanae Library. He was pleased to see the application made, disappointed to see that it was unsuccessful and stressed the need to explore every avenue to reopen the library.

The Chair advised the reason the application was unsuccessful was because it was not "shovel ready" however a project group has been set up which includes the Chair and Ms Stevenson-Wright. That group is looking at how the library might be re-established and hopes to be able to advise of progress in the near future. Mr Jefferson reassured the community that the Waikanae Community Board had advocated strongly to the Council re the importance of the library to the community, and noted there may be more opportunities in the future for funding from central government. Cr Prvanov reiterated the Board's desire to see the library reinstated.

Glen Wiggs voiced his concern about the danger from falling trees and branches at the Rangihiroa Domain. This is the same issue which he spoke about at the Waikanae Community Board meeting on 17 March 2020 (paper was tabled and attached to these minutes as **Appendix 1**).

Mr Jefferson advised he would request the Parks team to inspect the trees and provide an update to the next Board meeting.

The Chair raised the following matters:

- Correspondence was received today from the Mayor, suggesting a workshop with Community Board Chairs to discuss how Community Boards might work more effectively with Council. Mr Westbury would like Board members to meet and discuss what points and priorities they would like to see put forward, and advised he would send a meeting request.
- The Chair also advised he would like to use the Board's draft Strategic Plan, as drafted with Anne Pattillo, as the basis of community consultation to ensure the Board has its priorities right. He suggested socialising the draft document with the community, and Board members were in agreement.
