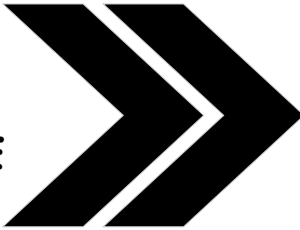
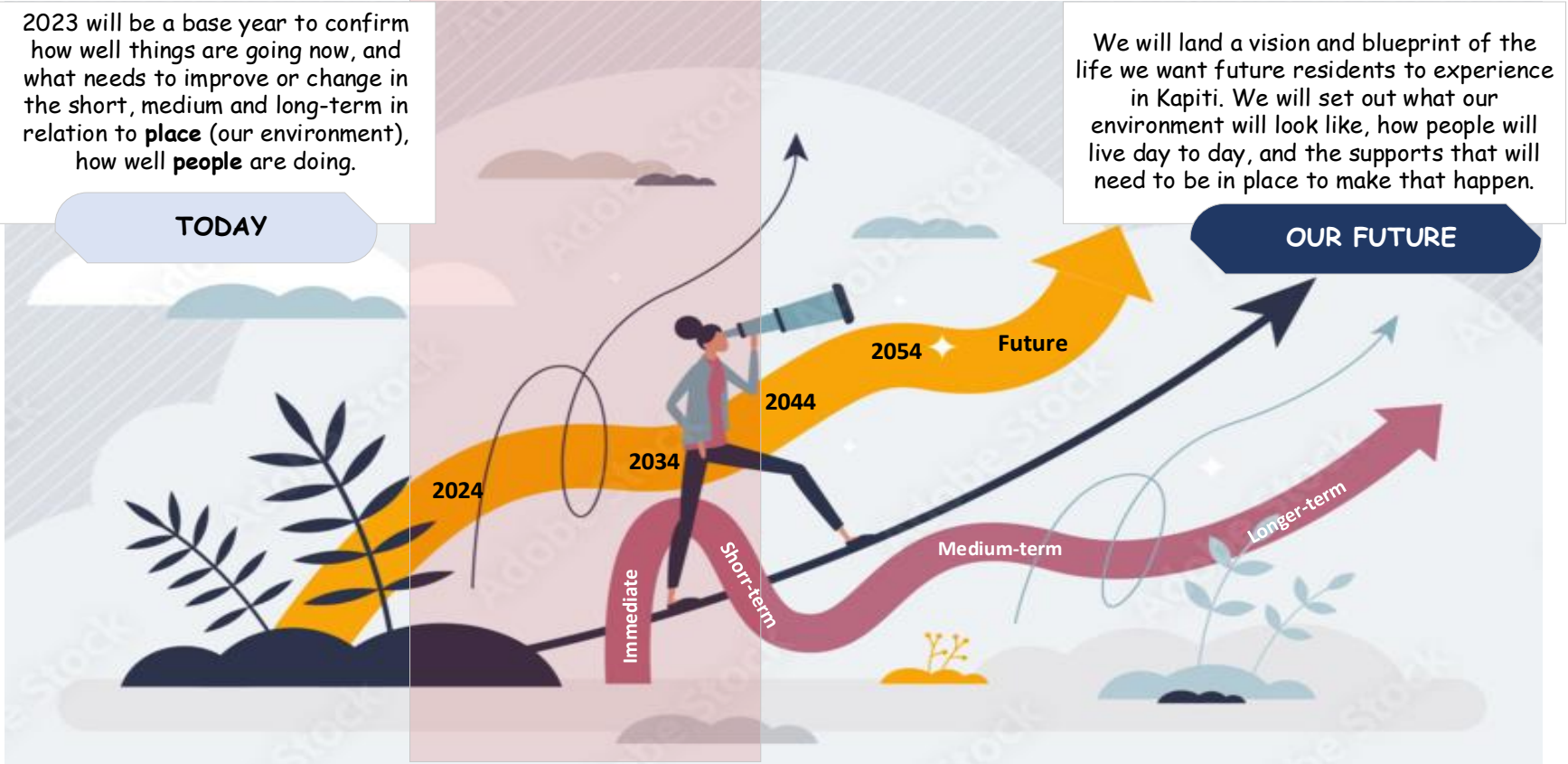


WHY KAPITI NEEDS A DISTRICT VISION AND STRATEGY FOR THE FUTURE

CHARTING A SUSTAINABLE AND AFFORDABLE COURSE FOR THE FUTURE TOGETHER



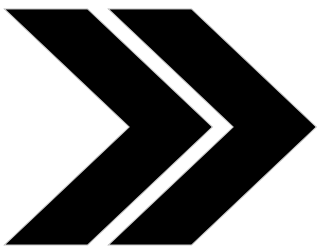
HOW TO GET INVOLVED:

- There will be a bunch of ways to have your say, whether you want to meet in person or online:
- Community Board representatives will be out and about holding 'pop-up' sessions and coming down to local gathering points to get your views.
 - Councilors will be holding a targeted series of korero and 'chat' events across the District, and engaging with business and key groups in the community, to identify what's most important to you. This will inform the priorities that are set for the future, and the Long-Term Plan for 2024-34.
 - Several online portals will enable you to share your thoughts – elected members will engage with you on facebook landing pages for each area of the District, and a District-wide page will cover things that affect us all.
 - We will send out surveys to smaller parts of the community make sure we've got it right.
